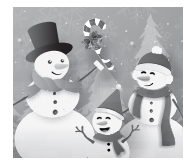

GREAT CRATES

Our Great Crates program is back for the third year! Great Crates allows for teachers in the Dearborn Heights school districts to sign up their classroom to receive a box of 30 grade-appropriate books for in classroom use each month. We will deliver the crate directly to your school, then after approximately six weeks we will take the crate away and replace it with another set of 30 books for your classroom.

MOR, OR MATERIALS ON REQUEST

MoR, or Materials on Request, allows for teachers and administrators to use school library cards to request supplemental educational materials to be directly requested from the library for use in the classroom. 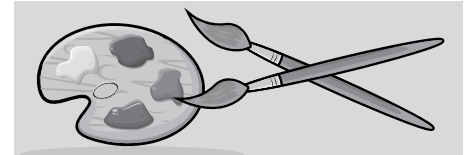
